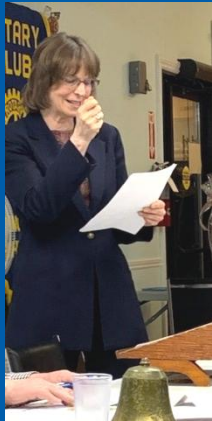

Later in The Rotooter, see the event poster that we are posting all over Town.

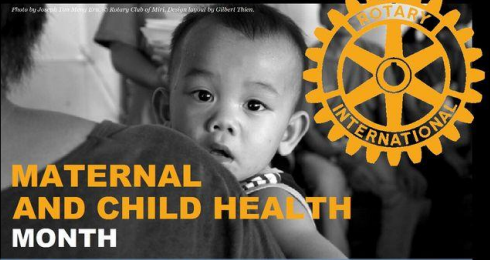
The Committee is asking all Members of our Club to participate in some manner at this our decades-old Community Spring Cleanup Event.

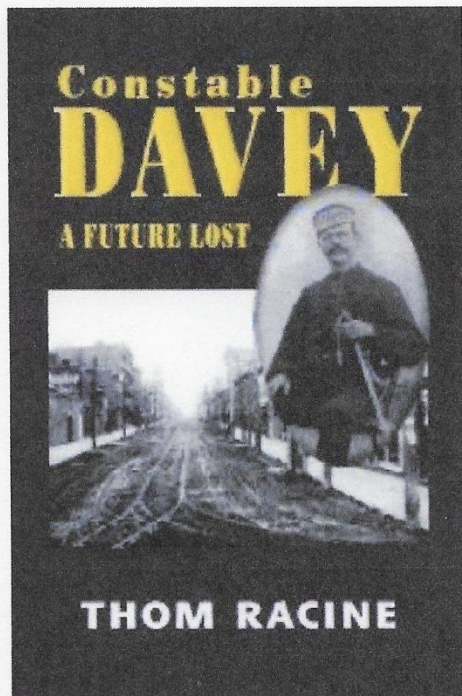
