There are not many times good news comes out of Haiti. News of good things happening from hard work and determination. News of long term planning that is coming together after many years of effort. News of new food sources and hope for the future.

Enjoy this email, enjoy the success, many have done their all. Many photos and videos are slowly being posted to the FB page.

We are winding up the work on combining 2 ponds. This will give us 2 large ponds now for raising Tilapia. The first pond is doing well, fish are growing, meals are happening.

As this next phase is coming to closure we will be gearing up another phase. We will be building a series of chicken coups at the fish farm for egg production. The chicken waste will be used to feed the fish. a vital win win combination.

The ORANGEVILLE ROTARY CLUB has announced a donation for some of this work. This will go a long way to building these solid structures and the purchase of chickens.

Along with chicken coups we will be researching and planning aeration for the ponds. A solar system will be built so that air pumps will circulate oxygen into the ponds. This will dramatically increase the yield of fish and increase the average weight. Lastly another pond will be looked at.

The grit and hard work of the Haitian men who dug these ponds has to be congratulated. I have sat around the table with them and heard their praises for me (all of us) for giving them this opportunity. I have seen their smiles and responsible attitude of knowing this is good for their island, there is hope.

Their desire to work hard for little money in such hot muddy conditions makes me proud of them. All they want is a hand up - not a hand out. Just a bit of money goes a long way in Haiti.

Thank you to all that have helped along the way. Thank you to many more who will help. I can only try to share the friendly genuine white smiles from black sweaty faces I receive in Haiti. The strong handshakes, the small gifts of shells, the heartfelt Captain Buce (they do not pronounce R's) I receive.

I am the lucky one, I get to meet all these good people who just need a few dollars and a bit of direction.

Chicken Coops Grant Approved! District 7080



Our District Grant application for \$2k USD in matching funds has been approved!

This, plus our RCO amount of \$2k USD, will cover the cost of constructing 2 Chicken Coops and work can now start this Fall before the Hurricane Season starts.

We will receive regular photos as this new project proceeds, same as has been done for the Pond Project.
