lle-a-Vache, Haiti:

Bonnie Melichercik & Bruce Leeming!

What a fascinating story these two presented tonight! So vastly different from our life in Canada. Hard to imagine the poverty and the daily struggles the Haitians must face each and every day.



Potary Rotary Ile a Vache is a small island off the south coast of Haiti.

Friends of Ile a Vache is a non-profit charitable group led by Bonnie and Bruce, with basically just their family and close friends in support.

Population is in some 10 villages of 1,000 people each, with no hydro and few roads. Friends of Ile a Vache focus on four critical needs of the people - Medical, Education, Clean Water and Food Security.

We have seen progress photos of the Fish Farm (pond) and the Chicken Coop to which we have donated funds. Crime is so bad that they even have a guard house at the pond for security. Why is the pond dug by hand - simply to provide hours for workers to earn money - they could bring in equipment but that's not the 'fair to all' way.

So many hardships - plastic sheet sails if they cannot get used ones from Canada; kids too sick from bad water they can't go to schools, so cisterns were provided; sewing classes so they can make their own cloths and repair their existing ones many times over; education costs \$60/yr for all supplies and \$250/yr at the high school level; etc., etc., etc.

sculpture, hand made from an oil drum side - Knut suggested we auction this at Doc's Auction and give the proceeds to Ile a Vache - Good idea; they need all we can give, and more! Bidders are lining up already!



The fellow who has brought the pvc pipe to the boat is not the usual Ile-a-Vache person, Wagner. It is proper in Haiti to have someone carry the stuff you purchase to your boat. It is their way of ensuring everyone gets a few dollars.



It would be below the store owner to carry your goods, and, if you were to carry them yourself, it would be considered not appropriate as you are taking a job away from someone that could be earning some money.

It takes anyone from outside to get used to having someone cart your stuff. Especially if it is a little something that you could just carry yourself
