### 3. Dictionaries (one for every local Grade 5

**4. Member Directed Funds:** Funds that individual members can direct to a charity of their choice. Due to cancellation of Ribfest, our Charitable Account is challenged, but we do want to make some funds available to assist the many local causes very much in need during the pandemic. The amount this year will need to be minimal, but is needed.



**5. Santa Claus Parade Float:** While currently still cancelled, the Town is trying to see if it can be reactivated in some form while respecting the challenges of the pandemic. Funds will not be spent if the solution is not acceptable.

**6. A/V Equipment for the Hall:** Provide funds to purchase equipment so that our Zoom meetings can continue once we return to the Hall but still have members who are not comfortable attending in groups. This will also allow members who are out of town or ill, etc. to participate.
