Due to the latest Government restrictions, this event has been delayed until further notice.

Hopefully we can hold it later in the Spring, but,at worst, we will try and hold it in the Fall like we did in 2021. The Town's Earth Week events have also been postponed.



Tonight's Speaker: Kendra Goss Coordinator, Signature Events & Community Engagement Headwaters Health Care Foundation



Kendra gave an excellent slide presentation that brought us up to date on all things Fundraising Activities, Pandemic Numbers, Hospital Equipment Needs and upcoming Events.

In 2019, numbers included 41,618 Emergency Department Visits, 795,592 Lab Tests, 898 Babies delivered all by 158 Physicians, 764 staff, 39 Medical Students and 453 Volunteers!

8 Inpatients currently with COVID-19, 138 Positive inpatients to date, 17 patients have unfortunately passed away, and 55 staff and physicians have tested positive to date. Some 76,245 Assessment Centre visits to date and 73,180 tests to date. Overall, Dufferin County has seen 1,401 confirmed COVID-19 cases to date and Caledon has seen 3,496 confirmed cases.

Currently there is a \$3.5 million campaign for Diagnostic Imaging Equipment, with \$1 million raised to date. There is a matching grant in place from a private donor who will match all donations before the end of May up to \$200,000.

Upcoming events - to take place in some format - include the Tour de Headwaters Walk, Ride or Run event on September 18, 2021. Details will be confirmed closer to the date and are dependant on whatever restrictions are in place at that time.

Always good to hear about the great things that happen at Headwaters, and to hear some amazing numbers each year. I'm sure that RCO, that has donated in excess of \$250,000 in the past, will continue to be generous, as a Club and as Individuals each year.




Rotary and the United Nations

Manchichi update, April 20, 2021

Our team of Ngäbe women, led by Lic. Patricia Mendoza, local program coordinator, have been diligently working on the community assessment now for a month and continue to adapt and improve efficiency in




data collection. So far, at least two communities have been thoroughly assessed (Cianca in the district of Mirono, and Chichica in Muna). Efforts are now focused in Hato Pilon, Mirono and Lajero, Nole Duima.


The team is working long hours and traversing long distances in difficult terrain but are feeling quite proud to be engaged in this effort. As expected, they are gaining valuable experience and knowledge of the communities that they will be eventually visiting weekly during the midwife training phase. Every household is visited within the community and the head of the households are interviewed using a list of over 80 queries ranging from Covid related questions to standard demographic

information (RE persons in the household, age, health status, health provider, education, living conditions,

pregnancies, and etc.).

Every Thursday our Manchichi team meets at the Fundacion (this office at the San Felix Catholic Mission provides meeting space with electricity and internet, two critical elements needed for tablet charging and data sharing). All data collected is transcribed and uploaded to the Phalarope Google drive of Dr. Rittmeyer who has software to process this (the same used for the Ixchel midwife project in Guatemala) and then shares the relevant mapping data with IGNTG. From this data, it will be possible to obtain a comprehensive picture of the health needs of the communities and to construct an effective plan for addressing the training program and medical referral system for phase 2. In addition to the weekly Zoom meetings to interactively discuss weekly activities and goals, Miriam stays in contact with the team via Whatsapp as cell phone data (sketchy coverage) permits.

A 5th staff member (part-time), Sra. Zuraika Jimenez, resident of San Felix, has been hired for her IT expertise. She was recommended by IGNTG to assist with trouble shooting data collection, transfers and related issues and has been a significant asset to the team. Other developments: We are in the final negotiations with the regional director of MINSA (Health Ministry) – Dr. Enilso Miranda, on an MOU agreement that defines their role in assisting with the cultural competency component of the project and with the critical protocols needed to establish the referral linkage for developing a health care continuum for difficult and high-risk pregnancies. Dra. Veronica Aguilar, MINSA appointed liaison to our project has been very instrumental in pushing this agreement forward as MINSA contends with overwhelming Covid infection and vaccination distractions. Side note: Like the Manchichi team, both Drs. Enilso Miranda and Veronica Aguilar are from this Comarca in which we are working.

Discussion with the Institute of the Woman (INAMU) are ongoing as we try to determine how they can best participate to support the program. Given the best likelihood of community assessment and GG application completion in June, we are calculating an 80% Rotary International match on the DDF funds pledged (as opposed to the regular 100% match). Regardless, it appears that we are currently at about 90% funding for Phase 2 thanks to the generous support across Panama, US and Canada. A listing of the clubs and Foundation that have pledged funds follows. Those followed by asterisks have provided DDF moneys which are eligible for Match. Also, note that the Boquete Rotary Club has received a number of private citizen donations.
