

The Ace has been Caught!

The Winning Pot was \$2,235. A new Draw will begin later this month - details to follow.

So, How Does the Raffle Work? Raffle Chair, Ingrid, explains:

Every week, there is only one weekly winner who is the holder of the ticket with the number that is drawn for that week.

The card selected by the winner has no impact on the amount the winner gets, unless the winner has selected the Ace of Spades (as just happened) they win the weekly jackpot and the progressive jackpot. A new one starts a week or two later.

- The weekly prize amount is 20% of the weekly ticket sales;
- the \$168 prize amount in the Dec 9th Draw, is 20% of total ticket sales for that week - \$840.
- \$252 (30% of \$840) went into the progressive jackpot, and \$420 (50% of \$840) went into the charity pot.

When the Ace of Spades is selected, the charity funds are then distributed based on each Club's percentage of total tickets sold.

As of December 30th, RCO has \$960 of ticket sales, which is about 12.89% of total ticket sales of \$7,450., less expenses, will be about \$450. for our charities - Hospice Dufferin & Choices Youth Shelter. RCO is 3rd in ticket sales of the 18 Clubs (RC Mississauga \$1,825 & RC Guelph Trillium \$1,360)
