- there are so many ways, big and small, that we can all do individually and as a society, to fight Climate Change, including:
 - reduce food waste
 - go to a Plant Based Diet
 - reforestation of tropical forests
 - reforestation of temperate forests (ours)
 - improve cook stoves - change from coal
 - add solar panels
 - management of refrigeration - no open freezers in stores
 - and many others
