Former Town Councilor Sylvia Bradley attended the October 11th meeting. Sylvia now lives in Panama for 6 months of the year and is very involved with the Rotary Club of Boquete. Sylvia spoke to us about a number of community projects the Boquete Club is involved with, including construction of dormitories and a dining/study hall at an Indigenous

school, a soccer and play park in Boquete, improving facilities at a home for abused children in Boquete, construction of a high school in a remote community, and training midwives in Manchichi. (RCO contributed to the Manchichi project, which was funded by a Rotary Global Grant.) The Club also runs a scholarship program and is currently supporting 17 university students and 2 secondary school students with scholarships.

The Farm's mission is to support the community with healthy, fresh, local food, and they grow a variety of cover crops and vegetables on 500 acres. And 7080 District Governor Sandhya Maini spoke to us about what she loves about Rotary and her thoughts on making the Rotary experience the best it can be. All in all, a wonderful evening!
